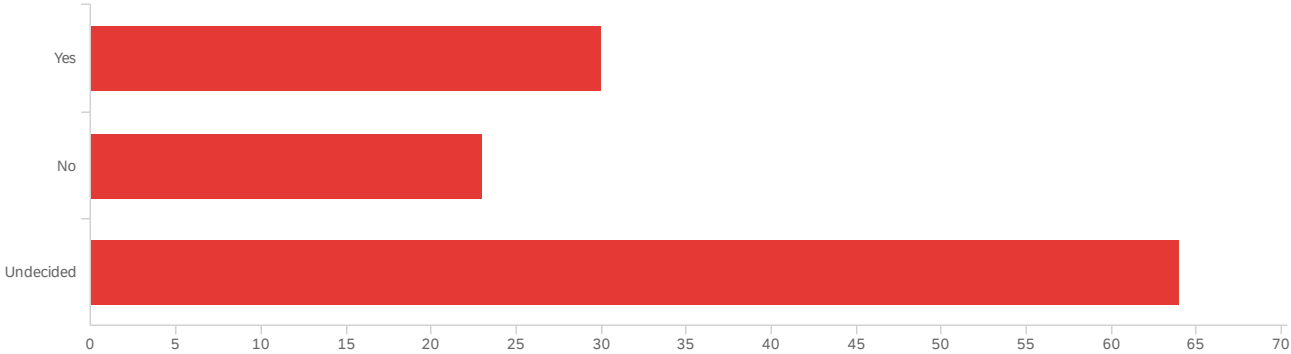

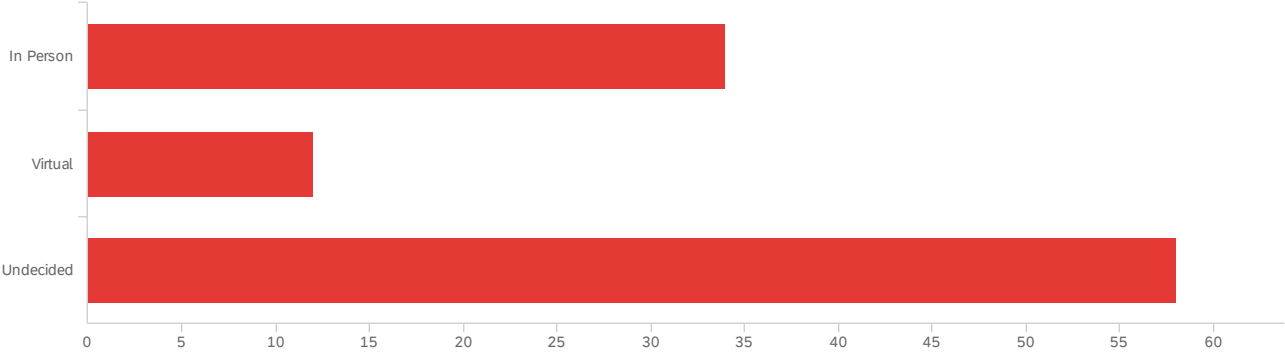
## 1. Will your school sponsor a prom this school year?

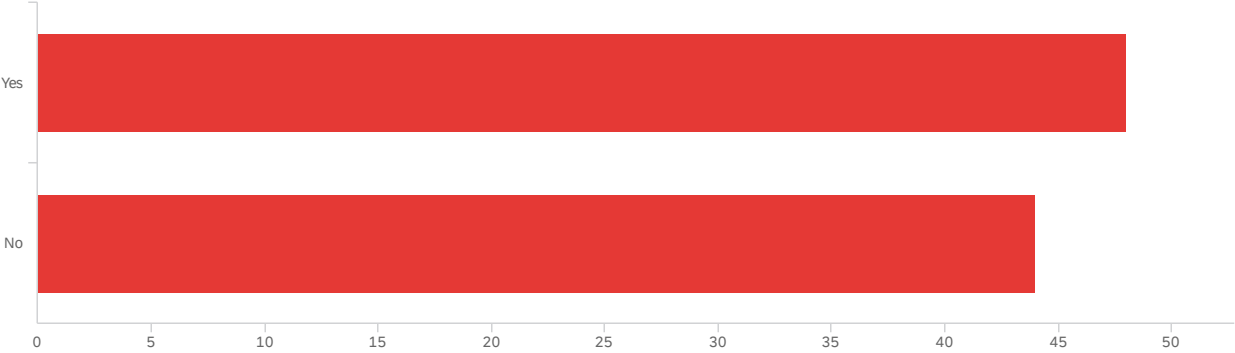
## 2. Will your prom be in-person or virtual?

This will be dependent upon the location. We are still exploring options but we will likely have to have a limit.

Most likely the Junior and Senior class. So about 120 to 140 students. Grand March will be live streamed.

We have no idea at this time.

Juniors and seniors

We would limit attendance to seniors only and not allow guest passes for students from other schools or students who have recently graduated.

Only Juniors and Seniors and no admittance to students from outside our district.

Not decided yet, but we will limit who is able to attend by grade level of likely won't allow guests who are not students in the district.

We are still undecided as to whether we will hold a prom or not. If we do hold a prom, it will more than likely be in-person. If we do hold an in-person prom, it will more than likely only be for our students (no visitors) and may be limited to juniors and seniors. We will look at numbers and decide based on that. We will make more decisions the closer we get to the end of March. That is our tentative deadline to decide whether we hold a prom or not.

Planning on having a junior and senior court as we did not have a prom last year.

Grand March with possible small dance.

We do not know at this time.

Exploring outdoor with tent(s)

We will not be holding a traditional prom with dancing, but we are hoping to hold some sort of event for seniors. We have put our senior prom committee in charge of coming up with an idea for an alternate event that would allow for social distancing and possible take place outside (renting a large tent), so I am not sure exactly what it would look like.

We will try to keep it as normal as possible, enforcing masks and distancing. Will try to have it outside if possible.

No outside guest. Students only with staff supervision. Will do a grand march.

We may consider a socially distanced Grand March in the outdoor (track/football) stadium. At this time, we are not planning on hosting a Prom at Jefferson HS.

Off campus with possibility of limiting to juniors and seniors (ours is a junior prom and senior homecoming) that both classes have missed out on.

We are undecided if we will hold an in-person event and if so, how we will make it happen.

Hopefully outdoors at a venue in late April

We are trying to find an outdoor places(outside of our county) to hold it since we can not have groups larger then 10 in our county. We are just starting our planning-knowing full well that it may be for nothing.

We are still working out the details

We are considering an in-person event right after the school year ends.

Grand march only is planned; all mitigations in place so we will not be having a dance.

In the past, we have held prom in either our fieldhouse or we rented an area facility.

We are splitting the classes Juniors and Seniors. The Juniors start with a formal dinner from 5 to 6:30 while the Seniors are attending a Magic/Illusionist Show from 5 to 6:30 with live streamed Grand March. Then they will flip and Seniors come back for Dinner from 7 to 8:30 and the Juniors will go to the Magic/Illusionist Show live streamed Grand March. Our goal is to give the students the opportunity to have a formal night out with some entertainment.

This is all very tentative but considering holding the event outside on May 15.

Outside on our plaza under a big tent

We are looking to hold the event outside and potentially limit it in terms of participants and timeframe.

We are considering an outdoor event late in the school year. No definitive plans yet.

Unsure.

At this time we have booked an outdoor wedding space to hold our prom. As we near May we will evaluate whether to have one or not.

Dinner and a magic show

We will hold court as usual and stream the event. The dance will most likely be in our large space. 1/2 football field with students spaced throughout. There will be no slow songs played. The event could obviously change depending on Covid levels in our school and community.

Outside--not sure where--might even just be on campus so we do not need to worry about getting groups of kids on buses.

Grand March in auditorium with limited attendance, will be streamed. Dance at school either outside or in commons.

Not a dance but rather we are looking at holding an event outside with music, food and a movie.

We will do the grand march - not sure if parents will be allowed to attend. It will be live-streamed.

5. If you are holding an in-person event please briefly describe your cerem...

Grand March, No Dinner, Dance. Pending our County Metrics as we get closer to the event.

We still have one slated for May and at this time it would be a regular event; but this is constantly being revisited.

I don't have many details, but: dinner tables have a max capacity and large, outdoor areas will be utilized.

We are not sure. We think we will use a restaurant/banquet hall in the area. Possibly with parents putting it on.

We are comfortable with the dinner and grand march as these are similar activities to the activities kids engage in each day at school. We will not be holding a dance and are trying to come up with alternate activities. We do plan to enhance the dinner with a DJ and games.

Large, outdoor venue. Later in the year than usual.

We may do the usual at a hotel with dinner but limit the number to 400 with 2 rooms of 200 each. Otherwise we talked about a movie night with food trucks or a third option of no hotel/dinner prom but eat out on own and use our two gyms for two different rooms to dance with two different DJ's in each room. We will more than likely shorten the time of prom from the usual time. Still have a photo booth

Discussing a formal dinner

Normal with masking and social distancing outside outdoor venue.

Possibly under a tent outdoors in May. Different locations under the tent for the junior grand march and then senior grand march, for decorating purposes.

Still TBD... Looking to host it outside and after school ends potentially.

Outdoor grand march Encouraging groups to be within their close friend circle we will use several buses to bring the kids to our outdoor venue for music, games, etc

We are doing a fancy formal dinner on-site. Students will still dress up, spend time with a cohort/group of friends, and we're seeking entertainment like an illusionist or singer.

We are looking at changing it from the traditional dance setting to more of a formal banquet with activities like a hypnotist, casino night, music, etc

I would like to plan an outside event, but WI weather is so unpredictable and all of our funds are tied up in down-payments for face to face venues to hold spots for next year. I'd love to hear other ideas.

Are schools trying to cater a meal or letting kids venture out on their own for dinner?

We held one discussion in our conference meetings that if everyone in the conference cancels prom we will have some guise of consistency. It will potentially stay that way until someone breaks.

Outside, limited numbers

We would like to host something but we struggle with the idea of hosting an event as it is almost inevitable that someone will have COVID and then we will be quarantining most of a grade or a large chunk of the school. Missing school is so hard on kids and also for the sports that are running.

We have a date reserved but will see. An idea that I have heard that may work for us would be to have a grand march outside on the football field that day. All of the couples that would have attended a dance would be announced and their parents could be in attendance. Afterwards, the students could go out to eat or whatever they had plans for, but there would not be a school sponsored dance.

At this point in time, we have not discussed whether or not we will be sponsoring a prom this school year.

Do it!

We will probably not be having prom this spring. Our students want to be able to have an event that is not restricted so we will probably wait for our junior group. We do junior prom and not senior prom.

A very challenging event if COVID is around us. All the precautions and mitigation strategies would be out the window holding an in-person prom.

Student Senate hosts our prom and our executive board of student senate said they'd prefer a dance over dinner if they had to choose only one.

Like athletic events, only two tickets will be provided to students on courts so we can limit visitors during the event.

If we can host all of these other events, we have to try and figure out a way to not have kids miss prom 2 years in a row... I am open to all ideas...thanks for putting together.

While personally not in favor, the community is insistent on a prom being held. They are willing to have the event held over risk of covid. We are talking with legal about a waiver for our school.

Our students took a vote. They voiced that receiving our DJ refund was more important than waiting closer to the date in hopes that we'd still have a prom.

at this time our DHHS guidance does not allow this to happen. I would like the results shared. Thank you for doing this!
